New York, NY - The Louise Blouin Foundation (LBF) is pleased to announce the seventh annual Blouin Creative Leadership Summit (BCLS), a forum in strategic partnership with the United Nations Office for Partnerships that engages in dialogue and exchanges best practices and strategies amongst an unparalleled group of world leaders from a wide array of disciplines to meet the challenges and grasp the opportunities of globalization. Timed to coincide just days before the **Clinton Global Initiative Annual Meeting** and the **United Nation's General Assembly,** the two-day Summit will feature panel discussions pertaining to economics, security, commodities, genetics, and education, as they relate to technology, innovation, and creativity. Other topics will include an annual favorite - culture beyond borders - as well as other subjects related to health care and global reform, business, neuroscience, the Middle East, and city design and planning.

This year's opening keynote address will be delivered by **Irina Bokova**, Director-General of **UNESCO**, who will discuss how to best face the challenges of globalization and coordinated global governance, with closing remarks presented by **Dr. lan Bremmer**, President of the **Eurasia Group**, who will share how global cooperation, reciprocity and engagement might be managed in a world without clear leadership.
